

The Honorable Tad Taube has dedicated his life to efforts strengthening the Jewish communities in both the United States and Poland. He has spearheaded efforts to preserve and celebrate Jewish heritage

and history, primarily through his leadership in Warsaw's planned Museum of the History of the Polish Jews and the Jewish Historical Institute, as well as the Jewish Cultural Festival in Krakow. In 2004, Polish President Aleksander Kwaśniewski awarded Mr. Taube the Commander's Cross, the highest civilian medal for foreigners. Mr. Taube has also served as president of the \$400 million Koret Foundation for the past 25 years, designating nearly \$30 million a year to Jewish and secular cultural and educational organizations in the San Francisco Bay Area and Israel.






